Before you start you'll need;


- Scissors or paper cutter
- String
- Hole punch
- Card or paper
- A suitable printer

# Instructions

1. Print off this page in colour on card or paper, each sheet will make a double sided piece of bunting. Print as many as you need for your bunting, we suggest a minimum of 15

triangles on around 2-3 metres of string, this will drape, so make it longer than you think!

2. Fold the page in half, then cut out the triangles.
